
Modern contraceptive prevalence rate

- 3. "The US government is the single largest donor for family planning in the region. The Global Gag Rule (The Mexico City Policy) risks disrupting the incredible progress of the past five years by reducing between 30 percent to 70 percent of resources necessary to current family planning programs."
- In addition to USAID, other donors and technical partners such as UNFPA, Marie Stop International, IPPF, are
 providing exceptional support to this somewhat neglected area of sexual and reproductive health and rights.
 The City of Mexico's policy will drastically reduce their ability to continue and maintain their support and run
 the risk of losing momentum and the spectacular progress achieved so far.
